The Tigard-Tualatin School District's Local Option Levy is up for renewal on the upcoming November 4 ballot. This property tax started in 2000 and was renewed in 2004 and 2008. Funds from the Levy provide an estimated **\$4.6 million** or the equivalent of 55 teaching positions to our District.

The Mathnasium TriMathalon is Coming

The following information and attached flyer from Mathnasium is about an event the group is conducting on October 18. The PSO is sharing these details and this flyer for informational purposes only. The PSO does not endorse the organization or the event in any way.

Mathnasium of Sherwood is sponsoring a TriMathalon event on October 18th. This FREE event is a contest designed to show kids that math can be fun. We would like to invite the elementary age students from Mary Woodward Elementary School to this event.

Children from 2nd - 5th grade at all levels of math ability are invited to participate. Each student who registers and attends this year will earn a participation prize! The winner at each grade level will be recognized and entered into the national TriMathlon.

At Mathnasium, we strive to help complement the local schools' efforts in engaging and encouraging kids in math and enhancing STEM efforts. As a math resource, we want to encourage every child, from students needing remediation to students seeking enrichment, to participate and experience the power of Math.

The competition will be scheduled by grade level starting at 8:00 am and will run until 5 pm on October 18, 2014 at the Sherwood Mathnasium Learning Center at 21300 SW Langer Farms Parkway, Sherwood, OR 97140. Participation is FREE.

The TriMathlon consists of three events:

- Magic Squares, where students are awarded points for developing their own math problems.
- The Counting Game, which tests students' ability to count from any number, to any number, by any number.
- Mental Math Workout, which asks students to solve problems without a pencil and paper in order to show off their "number sense."

The contest is open to all students in grades 2 through 5. Students do not need to be enrolled in a Mathnasium class to participate and there is no fee. Students must register at mathnasiumtrimathalon.com.

Leonardo da Vinci



Leonardo da Vinci was born in Italy on April 15th, 1452. Da Vinci is probably most famous for his painting called *The Mona Lisa*, but he was also a sculptor, architect, musician, engineer, cartographer, inventor, scientist, and a mathematician. Da Vinci was born in the Renaissance Period and, because of his many talents, he is often referred to as the world’s first Renaissance Man.

Da Vinci drew plans for buildings, bridges, helicopters and other flying machines. Although most of da Vinci’s inventions were never constructed, he is considered a genius because his ideas were centuries ahead of his time. For example, he drew a design for a helicopter in 1493.

Leonardo used math to study the proportions of human anatomy. For example, he used measurements to figure out that the full length of a body is 8 times that of the human head, the width of the face is equal to 5 eyes, and the distance from the chin to the hairline is equal to the distance from the wrist to the tip of the middle finger. Da Vinci used his findings of proportion to paint beautiful, realistic portraits and scenes of people.

Da Vinci died when he was 67. Very few of da Vinci’s works remain; perhaps there are some yet to be discovered.

For the month of October, students will create a self-portrait inspired by da Vinci’s use of mathematical proportions and earth tones when he sketched. Students will be reminded that renaissance period artists like Da Vinci used proportions throughout their art.

Did you know?

Da Vinci wrote backwards in an Italian short hand that he invented himself. Although he never said why he did this, it is thought that he did not want anyone stealing his ideas.
