

Claude Monet and Impressionism



Claude Monet, born in 1840, is the father of the impressionism art movement.

Monet's father wanted him to work in the family grocery business but Monet really wanted to be an artist. His mother, who was a singer, encouraged Monet to follow his passions.

After Monet was introduced to En Plain Air (in plain air = outdoors) painting, he would paint primarily outdoors and use the natural world as his subject.

Impression, Sunrise at an art show he and his impressionist friends put together. An art critic called Monet and his friends "Impressionists." This was meant to make fun them as critics said their paintings looked more like sketches than

as critics said their paintings looked more like sketches tha finished paintings. But Monet and his friends didn't mind and began calling themselves impressionists as well.

Monet liked to do "series" paintings in which he made several paintings of the same subject during different times of the day or seasons. He did a series of Haystack paintings as well as paintings of Rouen Cathedral and his garden.

In 1874, Monet exhibited



Monet's most famous paintings are those inspired by his garden pond. Monet designed and cared for his garden himself and often painted there.

Monet said he wanted his works to serve as a "haven of peaceful meditation," for museum visitors and be a source of calm for all who came to see them. Monet died in 1926.
