



MISSOULA CHILDREN'S THEATRE

is an incredibly fun, exciting, and rewarding experience for your child. But it also requires a great deal of commitment and dedication for these 6 days. Before you sign your child up for this residency, please read the following information carefully to be sure that both you and your child can commit to the residency requirements.

How Does It Work? Who Can Participate?

On Monday, October 30, two professional MCT Tour Actor/Directors will arrive at Mary Woodward for a week long residency with set, lights, costumes, props and makeup. Everything it takes to put on a play....except for a cast. The team will be holding an audition to cast up to 60 of our students to perform in a production of *Peter and Wendy*. **No experience is necessary.** Your child will take part in an audition on October 30th from 2:30-4:30 in the Mary Woodward cafeteria. During the audition, all children will be on stage for the entire two-hour session. No advance preparation is needed but some helpful hints include: smile, follow directions, speak loudly when it is your turn, listen respectfully when it is not, and have a good time! There is no guarantee that everyone will be cast in the play. Due to time constraints, anyone missing any part of the audition **will not** be considered in the casting of the show. Roles will be announced at the close of the audition period. Around 4-4:15pm on Monday near the end of the audition, children will receive their rehearsal schedule for the week. Not all cast members will be needed at every session, but those auditioning should clear their schedules for the entire week and if selected, be able to attend all rehearsals. Missing any rehearsals or exhibiting disruptive or negative behavior may result in your child being dismissed from participation in the show.

All parents (or family representative) should attend the last 15 minutes of the audition for a brief orientation and explanation of the residency. Rehearsals will begin for some children that same afternoon and the cast will continue to rehearse throughout the next five days. Monday – Friday the rehearsals will take place at Mary Woodward between 2:30 – 7:15 pm with a ½ hour break for dinner. The actual rehearsal times and dates will vary, depending on your child's role. Most 5-7 year olds will not be needed on Tuesday, Oct 31. However, every participant must be available for all assigned rehearsals. Be aware that some rehearsal times may not begin immediately after school and parents are responsible for arranging transportation for their child to all assigned rehearsal times. Siblings may be cast in different roles and may have different rehearsal schedules. Performances will be on Saturday, November 4th at 3:00 pm and 5:30 pm on stage at Mary Woodward Elementary School in the Cafeteria. The cast will have a four-hour dress rehearsal/costume/make up session before the first performance that day.

For older children that do not wish to perform on stage, MCT will also cast 2-4 Assistant Directors age 10 or older. AD's will help with the technical aspects of the production throughout the week. AD's will be asked to participate in the audition process, as they must demonstrate good listening skills, leadership, and the ability to follow directions.
